#### Tips to Prevent Symptoms of Seasonal Allergies


You can take some action now to prevent symptoms from slowing you down. Some symptoms can lead to more serious illnesses, including sinus infection, ear infections, or upper respiratory infections.

- ✓ When pollen counts start to rise, limit time outdoors
- ✓ Keep your windows and doors closed when pollen is at its
  peak
- ✓ Change your air conditioner filter, keep the air circulating to
  filter the outdoor air or use an air purifier indoors to clean
  the air of pollen
- ✓ Wash your hands frequently especially when returning from the outdoors
- ✓ Avoid outdoor activities that stir up pollen, such as lawn mowing, and wear a mask if they cannot be avoided
- ✓ Dry your laundry in the machine, not outdoors on a clothes line, to keep pollen off your clothing and bedding.
- ✓ Have a supply of allergy medication handy, such as antihistamines or Benadryl

#### **Quick Fact**

D.O.s also practice a holistic approach to patient care.




#### **Four Tips When Looking for a Nursing Facility**

- Call the Northern Virginia Long-Term Care Ombudsman Program and request a list of nursing homes in your area. They also will provide information on finding licensing reports and complaint histories of the facilities.
- ❖ Tour a number of homes and take special note of how the facility looks, how the residents appear, and how the staff members behave.
- When you settle on one or two nursing homes, call the Ombudsman Program again to discuss your choices. They may be able to provide additional information.
- Keep the Ombudsman Program's number handy. Once you or your loved one is placed in a facility, you can request help from them to resolve issues you may have regarding care.
